



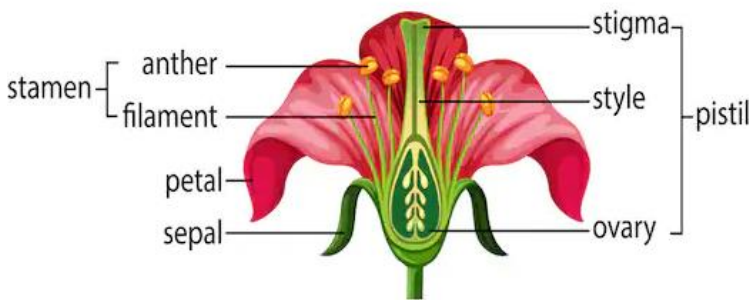
Revolting Children
