

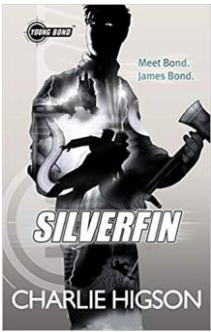


Secret Agent

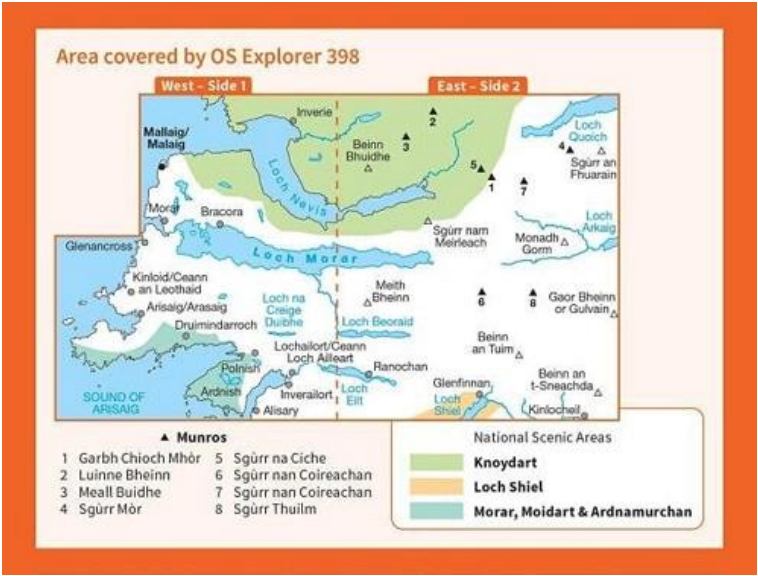
Dive into the world of Bond... James Bond.

Key Vocabulary	
Ordnance Survey map	These maps are at 1:25,000 scale, so every 4 cm on the map equals 1 km in the real world.
Symbol	Symbols on a map may be drawings, letters, lines, shortened words or coloured areas. Most map symbols are conventional signs as they are understood by everyone around the world; for example a lighthouse and church.
Key	The key on a map is essential since it contains what each symbol on the map stands for.
Aspiration	The hope or desire to achieve something,
Watercolour	Watercolour is a painting method in which the paint is made of pigments suspended in a water-based solution.
Composition	Composition is the placement or arrangement of visual elements or 'ingredients' in a work of art
Environmental impact	Possible negative effects caused by the release of a substance in the environment.
Dilemma	A situation in which a difficult choice has to be made.
Redemption	The action of saving or being saved from a mistake made in the past.
Quartermaster	An officer responsible for handing out supplies to the troops.
Vision	A plan held for the future.
Values	Principles or standards of behaviour; a judgement of what is important in life.
Adolescence	The period following the onset of puberty during which a young person develops from a child into an adult.
Adulthood	The state of being fully grown or mature.
Life expectancy	The average period that a person may expect to live.
Gestation	The process of developing inside the womb between conception and birth.
Foetus	An unborn or unhatched offspring of a mammal.
Hormones	A substance produced inside the body to stimulate specific cells or tissues into action.
Accelerate	An increase in rate, amount, or extent.
