

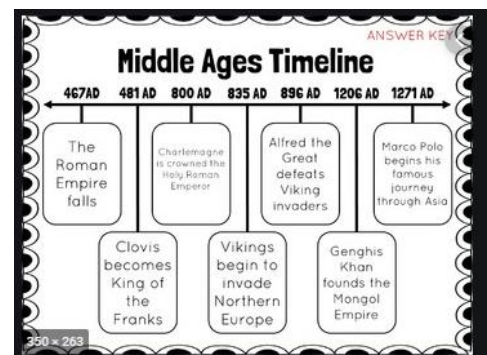
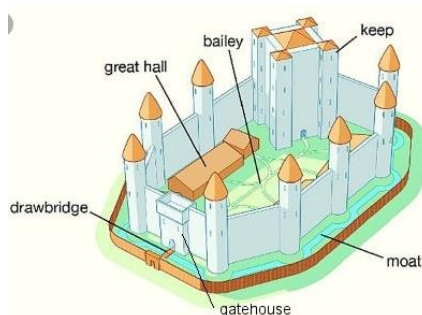
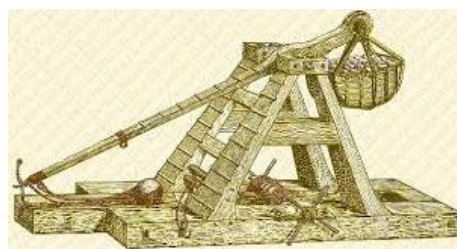
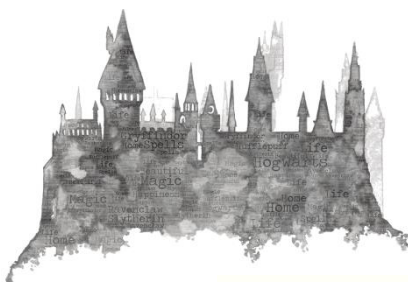


## You're a wizard, Harry!

Anglo-Saxons	German-Dutch settlers in Britain around the 10 <sup>th</sup> century.
Ordnance Survey	A high-quality map of a specific area of the world.
Drawbridges	Moveable Bridge at the entrance to a castle surrounded by a moat.
Applique	A way of decorating using fabric and needlework.
House Shields	Emblems that represent a group of people or a family.
Material/ substance	What something is made from.
8 point compass	A tool used to show directions.
Solution	A liquid mixture.
Dissolve	To become part of a liquid.
Philosopher	A person who loves wisdom and seeks it.
Balanced Argument	Two points of view about a topic.
Common Room	Shared area to relax in Hogwarts.
Platform 9 3/4	A magic platform at Kings Cross Station from which trains travel to Hogwarts.
Boarding School	A school that allows its pupils to live within it.
Loyalty	To be faithful and true to someone or something.
Portcullis	A strong, heavy grating that can be lowered down grooves on each side of a gateway to block it.
Trebuchet	A machine used in medieval siege warfare for hurling large stones or other missiles.
