
Run Rabbit Run

Key Vocabulary	
Seasons	The 4 parts of the year (Spring, Summer, Autumn, Winter) which change with the earth's position in relation to the sun.
Equator	An imaginary line around the middle of the earth at an equal distance from the North Pole and the South Pole.
North Pole	The Northernmost point of the earth.
South Pole	The Southernmost point of the earth.
Drought	A long period of low rainfall leading to a shortage of water.
Crops	A plant that is grown as food such as a grain, fruit or vegetable.
Allotment	A small piece of ground used to grow crops.

England has 4 seasons:

Spring (March, April, May)

The season after winter and before summer, in which vegetation begins to appear.

Summer (June, July, August)

The season between spring and autumn when the weather is usually the warmest of the year.

Autumn (September, October, November)

The third season of the year, when crops and fruits are gathered and leaves fall.

Winter (December, January, February)

The coldest season of the year between autumn and spring.



On a hot summer's day the temperature in England is approximately $25\,^\circ\text{C}$ compared to a cold winter's day which could be as low as $0\,^\circ\text{C}$.

As Cape Town is closer to the equator than England, its temperature on a hot summer's day will be 35°C and 16°C during winter. The seasons in Cape Town are opposite to the UK. When it's summer for us, it's winter in South Africa!

Fun Fact: It takes about 12 weeks for a carrot to grow to full size but this depends on the weather. Ideal conditions are warm days and nights along with plenty of sunshine and rain which is why they grow so well in our British climate.
