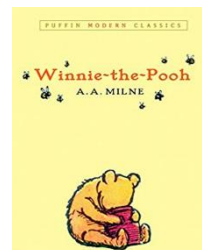




# Winnie the Pooh

| Character         | A person in a story   |
| Author            | A person who writes stories   |
| Illustrator       | A person who draws or creates pictures  |
| Honey             | A sweet, sticky yellowish-brown fluid made by bees and other insects from nectar collected from flowers.      |
| Human feature     | A human feature is something man - made or it was made by a human being. E.g. buildings                       |
| Physical feature  | A physical feature is something which is natural - it happens naturally. E.g. land, water within a land, soil |
| Puppet            | A movable model of a person or animal   |
| Natural materials | A natural material is any product that comes from plants, animals, or the ground.                             |
| Forest            | A large area covered with trees and undergrowth.  |
