




# The Chocolate Room

- Cocoa grows on trees in hot and wet places (mostly in countries that are 20 degrees north and south of the equator).
- White chocolate has no cocoa solids in it.
- Cacao trees were so valuable that civilisations, such as the Maya, used them as money.
- The first chocolate bar was created by Joseph Fry in 1847.
- It takes around 500 cocoa beans to make a bar of chocolate that is 450g. A cocoa pod only produces 40-50 beans.
- The Mayan's made the first chocolate drink which was cold cacao, mixed with water and a bit of chilli. It was called Xocolatl.
