WEEK 10 - Friday 18 November 2022

Hello to all our year 11 students and their families,

Apologies that my previous blog was missed; it has been a busy few weeks.

Towards the end of the first half term, students have been asking for after school revision sessions with subject teachers and maximising the LRC facility in school. Past papers, creating flash cards, team work etc... have been quickly established and are now becoming a routine. It has been great to see how the previous year groups have been such significant role models and staying behind to revise is now becoming a routine part of the day for most Year 11 students.

Hopefully, our younger students will see this in the coming months and start to see what awaits them when they reach this crucial time in school.

In the past couple of weeks, Mrs Green and I have also been helping students' complete applications for the Sixth form, College, or Apprenticeships. It has been fantastic to see the students realise that setting this up early is one important thing off the list and getting it done - with a back-up - is a priority for this half term. If any of your children need this support, please let us know.

Last week, the year group received their exam timetable, and it is fair to say there were some flabbergasted expressions as they realised how many exams they were sitting. I did tell them that they do become more spread-out by the time we get to summer; however, doing them in school only gives us a limited window.

This week, Year 11 are currently in the full throes of their first round of mock exams, and it is a pleasure to say that they have shown great resilience and determination. For those exams that involve the full year group, students have conducted themselves with maturity and are prepared to see how much they recall from year 10 and what they have covered this year. Talking to the students they have been saying they are 'Tiring,' 'Go too fast,' and 'My hand is going to drop off.' The cherry on the top made me smile, 'They are preparing us for summer, so that's fair.' It has been good to see how they are seeing the value in sitting the mocks and understanding how important they are.

With the mocks has also come a ride through the emotional rapids for several students; a realisation that revision does matter; and some additionally stress and worry. Myself, Mrs Green, and other staff have been reminding them to give it their best and that we still have time to fill the gaps in the jigsaw. Mock results allow teachers to see what we still need to go through, areas that need to be revisited, and prepare and deliver interventions. I remind students daily that, as a collective body, we have all the support and teaching necessary; they must embrace that, being the makers of their own destiny. We are always here to support the students, so please remind them of this if they forget - they are not alone.

As we plan for life beyond school, a high number of Year 11s have taken part in our Sixth Form Taster Day this week, trying subjects they wish to develop further, whilst exploring new subjects such as Criminology and Product design.

It is fair to say, we never have a dull moment, and this year is keeping us all on our toes.

Hello to all our year 11 students and their families,

Again, Year 11 have continued to have a remarkably busy couple of weeks. Thank you for your attendance at their Progress Evening last night; it was lovely talking to you all about your experience of the evening and about progress and future plans.

The mocks, mentioned in my previous Blog, ended and the sheer relief on the faces of students was evident. It was undoubtedly a gruelling couple of weeks for them, but an experience for them to become comfortable with the repeated nature of entering the exam hall, sitting papers in timed conditions, and reflecting on their performance afterwards. Mocks do not only allow staff to gather data and see how we can support students in the coming months, but they also help the students to develop resilience and integrity as they prepare for the summer of 2023. They will have a second round of mocks in February, either side of the half term break.

Following on from the mocks, myself, Mrs Meir, and Mrs Craft-Watson will be sitting down to look at the support we can tailor for students in the year group. Additionally, Heads of Department and their staff will be looking at the areas of development required by classes and individuals - tailoring their lessons to ensure they fill any gaps in knowledge, whilst considering the use of timing students who struggle to write under pressure and much more. In the new year the Period 6 sessions will increase, again with us looking to ensure students can access all subjects and avoid clashing sessions.

On Monday, the year team met and discussed how we can support the year group; there were many ideas discussed, with some fantastic practice shared amongst our team. One thing that is a need is to find some fun and enjoyment to lift spirits during the next six months. We have started this with an advent calendar for each group, which has lifted the mood in the morning. I am now planning some combined revision and activity sessions to merge the studying with a chance to relax and make memories - more to follow in the new year.

Another thing which is now in full swing is the 6th Form interview process. Mr Jarmen is meeting with the students who have expressed interest in staying on here and this will continue between now and the end of term.

As we move through the next couple of weeks, students will continue in normal lessons and be receiving their grades from the mocks. Lessons still require attentiveness and full engagement. Next week, some students will be off timetable to finalise coursework required for Photography, Art and Drama. Their teachers will inform them of when this will be.

Lastly, the final week of term sees year 11 have their second Careers Week. Miss Lawes will be explaining the format of the week to students next Monday and this is another chance for them to build the foundations for their life beyond year 11.

Hello to all our Year 11 students and their families,

The start to the new year has been very positive for Year 11 and they are getting into the swing of knuckling down and applying themselves in their studies.

Mrs Craft-Watson has worked tirelessly to create a reward system that allows students and tutors to track attendance, Period 6 Revision, Positive ATL, Progress, Independence and Conduct. All students should have a card booklet now, in which they can collect their rewards. (We have reminded them to check their pockets before putting their uniform in the wash basket!)

All achievement points collected will accumulate to a range of rewards for Year 11 students; this hopefully will improve engagement, support with attendance, and celebrate student successes with them.

This week during tutor time, students received templates for creating revision timetables. Myself, Mrs Green, and the tutors will be encouraging them all to map out where they are learning, revising, and attending interventions-whilst also remember that breaks, fun, relaxation are equally necessary when thinking about their self-care and mental health.

The P6 interventions are thriving and the uptake and attendance so early on is a further example that our year group are committed to achieve their full potential in the future. If there is not a subject session relevant, students are using the LRC after school and personalising their revision and accessing past papers online. To further support students, we are now offering lunchtime revision space. Those who are joining our Sixth Form in September may use Tranby House whilst the LRC is available to our other students.

Last week, our year group experienced 'Mock Interview' day (for me, one of the best days of the school year) and it went terrifically well. Students arrived looking savvy and swish in their business-like attire; the interviews ran like clockwork, and the atmosphere was electric. This was followed by target setting with their teachers, gathering an understanding of the individual goals that they each have as we build towards the final exams this summer. They then also enjoyed a talk by Motivational speaker and comedian, Moj (From PUSH).

Prom update: The Prom is confirmed for Friday 23rd June and will be held the 'The Country Park Inn' on Hessle Foreshore. In the coming weeks I will finalise the plans regarding times, costs, and purchasing tickets. Hello to all our year 11 students and their families,

Hello to all our year 11 students and their families.

We are surviving the ever-evolving whirlwind that is spinning around us in the build-up to exams and the students are hanging on tight and making the most of all the support that is available to them.

The mock exams finished last week and this week teachers have been sharing the marks with students. As is always the case, there have been happy tears and disappointed faces; however, what we get from these now is clear priorities for each learner and they can create revision timetables designed to target the areas of need.

On Thursday we held our first 'Success Day' at Water Edge, Barton. A group of students boarded our minibuses and ventured over the bridge to develop their skills in English and Maths. Their effort and engagement was exemplary and the students found the session both useful and enjoyable. Following this, we will be running a further two 'Success Days' in the coming weeks.

Looking at the engagement of students in their learning, I am proud to say that we have 98 students in the year group that attend an after-school session 5 nights a week. Alongside this there are many more in the year group accessing the period 6 sessions and using the LRC for independent revision. Now the mocks are over, period 6 revision sessions are continuing daily, and students have access to the list of sessions via email and in their tutor rooms.

March is a busy month in many of our practical subjects, with many of the courses having deadlines to meet for the coursework element of the unit. Please can you remind your child about the need to be aware of the deadlines and to ask for any necessary help. If they are struggling to access computers and software, we have rooms available after school for them to access and complete their folders.

In tutor sessions, and then appointments with Miss Lawes and Myself, we have checked the future destinations for students and helped others apply for their next step placements. Hopefully, before we finish for Easter, we will have an idea of where they are all hoping to go and be supporting them with interviews.

Looking ahead, Thursday 9th March is our next Year 11 Information Evening for parents/carers and students. The event starts at 4.30 with a presentation at 5pm in the main hall and a variety of stands with subjects' specific information- useful for the coming months of preparation. Each student will receive a gift bag that contains some great resources to help support them as we progress towards the final hurdle. The event will finish at 6pm and an email will be sent to confirm everything shortly.

I am also now finalising some of the things that the students are looking forward to the price of our prom; information and photographs for the yearbook; and leavers hoodies.

I think, for now, that is everything.

Hello to all our year 11 students and their families.

We are now just six school weeks from the first GCSE exam and it seems surreal that we are closing in on the end of the year. His story is a journey that demonstrates resilience, courage, and determination. The students later spoke with compassion and empathy for all he has had to go through- again, making me a proud Head of Year.

Whilst working towards the exams, students have been buzzing about ordering their leavers hoodies and comparing the colour options with their friends; I am looking forward to receiving them in June and getting a photo of the year group wearing them- It will be like an explosion of skittles on the school field.

They are also talking about the Yearbook and have been sending me any candid snap shots that they think would be good additions. Please remind your child that I am still accepting appropriate entries, before we start the final cut. New headshots are going to be taken of each student on May 11th; this will replace the old, younger, images and be arranged in tutor group order in the book.

- Relaxing in your favourite way, whether that's watching TV, playing on the games console, dancing around to your favourite tunes or having a bubble bath
- Getting an early night and a fantastic night's sleep

Being relaxed and well rested with your blood heartily circulating around your body is the healthiest way to prepare. It will mean that in the morning your mind is sharp, ready to dredge up everything you've revised, and nimble enough to make the most of what you know, even if you can't give the perfect answer to the question in front of you.
