Just a few points to note:

Bags:

A few large rucksacks have crept into the school at the start of this year. Please refer to the uniform policy on the website which stipulates a drawstring PE bag and a book bag. Space is limited and bulky rucksacks become a health and safety risk when spilling onto the floor or crammed into a classroom. Thank you for your cooperation with this.

Earrings:

If your child has their ears pierced, earrings must be taken out on PE days please, otherwise pupils will be unable to participate in PE, which is a legal requirement. If your child can remove their own earrings, it may be an idea to supply them with a small pouch or envelope to put these in. Earrings cannot be taped up for PE lessons.

Collection from school:

As you are aware, recently, the school has changed information systems, which means we no longer use the SIMS Parent communication system. We are currently in the process of setting up Arbor Parent Portal, which will give you the facility to change collection data yourself. However, until this is in place, should you need to make additions or changes to your child's collection list, please either print a form from the website or request one from the school office. Please ensure that your child's list is up to date as we appreciate how frustrating it can be if you send someone to collect your child on your behalf and they are asked to wait until we have confirmation. Please also remember that our number one priority is to safeguard your child so we will always seek confirmation before allowing your child to be collected by an unnamed adult.

As I passed a Year 2 classroom this week, I had to do a double take when I noticed that all of the tables were upside down and the children were sitting on them, swaying. Thankfully, it was then explained to me that the learners were in fact sneaky pirates and that they were getting in character ready for some very exciting writing this week! OOOH ARRRR!

Year 6 have been carrying our market research on wartime recipes this week and have had a wonderful time baking and tasting their own savoury potato biscuits! The school smelled wonderful. This formed part of their food technology DT week.

This week, I sent out a survey to parents to ascertain how they would like parents' evenings to be delivered. An overwhelming majority (175 at last count) said in person, with 45 choosing either and only 17 preferring online. Would a Parent Council be beneficial as a bridge between the school and families who may be reluctant to call the school for whatever reason? Do people know that they can contact ppsoffice@hessleacademy.com and that their messages are passed to the appropriate person? How can we increase parental engagement in general? What is the best way to get feedback from all of these questions that we have just discussed?

It was decided that we would all go away and consider these points carefully, with a view to reaching some decisions at our next meeting in January. But we would like your input too – it is about you, after all. If you have any suggestions of ways in which we could ensure we reach all parents, please do email the address above and I will present these to Governors at our next meeting. Thank you for helping us to strengthen the Penshurst community.

One final request – please do remember that we are a no-smoking site, and this does include the use of vapes. Thank you for your cooperation.

Please remember that next Friday, your child can dress in a Christmas item (jumper / tinsel / hat /onesie / reindeer costume – the possibilities are endless!). Please also note that on this day, school finishes at 2pm.

The weather is really ramping up its chill-factor now. Please be careful on the ice (or snow, maybe?) this weekend. Look after each other – one week to go!

Mrs Paoli intends to walk Marlowe round the school on his first visit and introduce him to classes from the door. Please remember to complete the opt-out form shared with you previously, or inform us by email (office@hessleacademy.com) should your child have any allergies or a fear of dogs, so that we can ensure they do not meet. Thank you.

We have been made aware of a couple of incidents whereby a male in his 40s/50s (described as wearing black and carrying a backpack) has followed pupils from the Hessle High School site as they have been walking home. Some of you may have seen a post on a Facebook page. Police have been informed of this, but it may be astute to discuss this with your child(ren) so that they know what to do in such an event. We plan to address this in our assembly this afternoon. However, we will approach this from a general keeping safe angle.

I would like to thank everyone for their support with recycling used uniforms. We are now at capacity for smaller sizes, but these can be taken to Sainsburys where there is a uniform drop-off point. However, we would still appreciate any larger sizes that you no longer require. If you are in need of some uniform and would like to take advantage of our recycling system, please contact the school office and we will arrange to pick the items for you for collection.

Safeguarding notes from Mrs Paoli:

Concern in the Local Area

As mentioned above, there have been reports of children being followed by a man in aged between 40-50 years old in Hessle. He has followed children, walking closely behind them and then watched them walk into their house. Please be extra vigilant, speak to your children and report any concerns to the police and school.

Domestic Abuse

Throughout the areas of East Riding and Hull there has been an increase in the number of Domestic Abuse incidents.

What is domestic abuse?

We define domestic abuse as an incident or pattern of incidents of controlling, coercive, threatening, degrading and violent behaviour, including sexual violence, in the majority of cases by a partner or ex-partner, but also by a family member or carer.

In the majority of cases, it is experienced by women and is perpetrated by men. However, women can also be the perpetrator in lots of cases.

Domestic abuse can include, but is not limited to, the following:

 \cdot Coercive control (a pattern of intimidation, degradation, isolation and control with the use or threat of physical or sexual violence)

- · Psychological and/or emotional abuse.
- · Physical or sexual abuse.
- · Financial or economic abuse.
- · Harassment and stalking.
- · Online or digital abuse.

The Dark Web

There has been an increase in young children and adults accessing the 'Dark Web.'

What is the Dark Web? There are three different parts of the internet: the Open Web, the Deep Web and the Dark Web. The Dark Web is the hidden part of the internet. Dark Web sites do not appear on search engines and can only be accessed using a dedicated anonymity software such as Tor.

Why Might a child access the Dark Web? There are a number of reasons why a child might want to use the Dark Web. These include:

Curiosity about technology and the online world.

Privacy concerns.

Accessing illegal content or services.

Because they have been coerced or forced to access the Dark Web by someone else.

This week, Mr Thorp, our Computing Lead, would like to share some information with you on Online Safety, something which continues to be an issue where children are allowed to access social media underage:

I recently had the opportunity to participate in a webinar focused on Digital Safety, where the importance of parental engagement in their child's online world and strategies to ensure their safety were discussed. While there are no fixed rules regarding when children should be given access to technological devices, it is crucial to recognise that such access comes with the risk of encountering inappropriate content or behaviours. As parents and educators, it is becoming increasingly vital to empower children to report any negative experiences promptly and without hesitation or fear.

Typically, we emphasise to children the importance of reporting such behaviours to parents or teachers. However, children can also report them directly online through the following website: https://www.ceop.police.uk/ceop-reporting/. We understand that reporting inappropriate behaviours can be daunting for children, so it would be extremely beneficial if you could take the time to visit this website with your child or children and discuss what steps they should take if necessary. In a recent poll, it was found that the majority of children desire their parents' involvement in their online presence, enabling them to openly discuss any issues that may arise without the fear of being restricted from the platforms they use.

During the webinar, I was introduced to an app called 'Qustodio,' which I believe is a fantastic tool that can help both children and parents feel safer while using the internet. Qustodio offers a range of features that promote digital safety, such as content filtering, time management, and monitoring of online activities. By using this app, parents can establish healthy boundaries and provide a secure online environment for their children.

In order to better support you and align our curriculum with your needs, I would like to invite you to complete a survey. Your feedback will assist us in enhancing our educational programmes and addressing any concerns or areas of improvement related to digital safety. A note from Mrs Paoli, Designated Safeguarding Lead:

This week I attended a contextual safeguarding meeting as I am part of the Contextual Ambassadors team where social workers and other professionals meet and discuss how we can further safeguard the young people in our community.

What is contextual safeguarding?

It is an approach to protect children and young people from harm or abuse that occur beyond their immediate family environment. It recognises that young people can be vulnerable to risks and harm within their wider social and community contexts, such as peer groups, schools, neighbourhoods and online spaces.

The West Team covers Goole, Howden and Haltemprice areas including Hessle.

In Hessle, there has been an increase in referrals for service and exploitation support. The isolated incidents have been occurring online rather than community based.

The perpetrator/s have been targeting individual children and young adults online and grooming them.

Please continue to monitor all your child's online activity and act if you see any changes in behaviour.
