
## Right to Fight

It's February 1941 and with London unsafe, Olive and her brother are evacuated to the Devonshire coast to stay with a mysterious lighthouse keeper. There, Olive must solve a mystery of her own: a strange, coded note which seems to link Sukie to Devon, and to something dark and impossibly dangerous. In this theme we will look at the significance of World War II and the impact it had on Britain, specifically the use of the land during the war years and how this effected trade links and the distribution of natural resources.



Key Vocabulary		
Evacuation	During the Second World War there was organised evacuation (movement) of children from London or big cities to the countryside.	
Evacuee	A person evacuated from a place of danger.	
Propaganda	Posters used to influence an audience for a particular reason.	
Allies	A state formally cooperating with another for a military or other purpose.	
Axis	The alliance of Germany and Italy formed before and during the Second World War, later extended to include Japan and other countries.	
Invasion	An instance of invading a country or region with an armed force.	
Rationing	Allow each person to have only a fixed amount of something.	
Holocaust	A term used to describe the murder of 6 million Jewish people by the German Nazi Party.	
D-Day	The day (6 June 1944) in the Second World War on which Allied forces invaded northern France by means of beach landings in Normandy.	
VE Day	The day (8 May) marking the Allied victory in Europe in 1945.	
Blitz	An intensive or sudden military attack.	
Justice	Justice is to be treated fairly or behave in a fair way.	
Conflict	A serious disagreement or argument which lasts for a long time.	
Topography	The arrangement of the natural and artificial physical features of an area.	
Natural Resources	Resources that naturally occur in nature and can be used for economic production or consumption like oil and coal.	
Settlement	A place, typically one which has been previously uninhabited, where people establish a community.  OR An official agreement intended to resolve a dispute or conflict.	

Key Dates		
1st September 1939	Germany invaded Poland	
3 <sup>rd</sup> September 1939	UK and France declared war on Germany.	
10 <sup>th</sup> May 1940	Winston Churchill became Prime Minister of Britain, taking over from Neville Chamberlain.	
14 <sup>th</sup> May 1940	The Home Guard was created (The Local Defence Volunteers).	
26 <sup>th</sup> May-4 <sup>th</sup> June 1940	The evacuation of British and French troops from Dunkirk, France.	
June 1940	German troops occupied the Channel Islands.	
10 <sup>th</sup> June 1940	Italy declared war on Britain and France, and allies with Germany.	
10th July-31st October 1940	The Battle of Britain
