

Dinosaurs

Dinosaur	A reptile from the Triassic period.
Mary Anning	(21 May 1799 – 9 March 1847) An English fossil collector, dealer, and palaeontologist who became known around the world for finds she made in the cliffs along the English Channel.
Artefact	An object made by a human being, typically one of cultural or historical interest.
Chronological	A record of events in time order.
