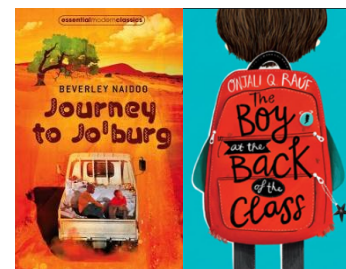


# Finding Freedom



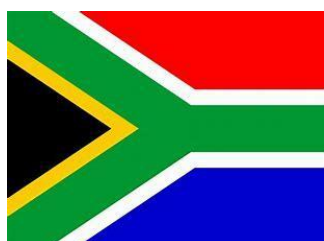

Key Vocabulary	
Nelson Mandela	He was a former President of South Africa. He ended apartheid.
Apartheid	A law that was passed to separate black and white people in South Africa.
Township	A suburb or city of predominantly black occupation in South Africa.
Time Period	A specific amount of time.
Inequality	A lack of fairness.
Thematic Map	A map that focuses on a specific theme or subject area.
Chronology	The arrangement of events or dates in the order of their occurrence.
Johannesburg	The largest city in South Africa.
Society	A number of people living together.
Slavery	The state of being a slave (a person who is the property of someone else and is forced to provide unpaid work/labour).
Orientation	The position of something, such as Landscape or Portrait.
Landscape	The position of a piece of paper when its longest side is horizontal.
Portrait	The position of a piece of paper when its shortest side is horizontal.
Nathan Murdoch	A Scottish gravity artist.

1948	Start of Apartheid.
1963 - 1990	Nelson Mandela's prison sentence.
1994	End of Apartheid.
1994 - 1999	Nelson Mandela was President of South Africa.
19 <sup>th</sup> June	American independence from slavery (Juneteenth).
