

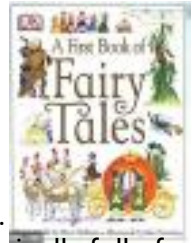


Who's Afraid of The Big Bad Wolf?

Capital City	A city where a government is based.
English Heritage	A charity that manages over 400 historic monuments, buildings and places. These include prehistoric sites, medieval castles, Roman forts and country houses.
Fortified Structure	A military building designed for the defence of territories during a war.
Adventure	An unusual and exciting or daring experience.
Paul Klee	A famous French painter who painted lots of scenes with castles.
Wellbeing	When you're comfortable, healthy, or happy.
Secure	When you are safe and unthreatened.
Character	A person in a novel, play or film.
Hero	The main male character in the story, who is usually strong and brave.
Villain	The evil character in a story.
Artefact	an object made by a human being, typically one of cultural or historical interest.
