Integrity


We do the right thing.

Throughout The Hessle Academy, every learner and member of staff is part of a house community. Each house has a specific identity and forms a community within the wider school. We strongly believe that this provides learners with an increased sense of belonging.

At Penhurst, the four house teams are named after penguins: Rockhoppers, Snares, Kings, Emperors.

We also have a school mascot called 'Pablo the Penguin' who runs his own shop (you can read more about Pablo's shop on the next page).

CELEBRATIONS


At Penshurst, we like to celebrate pupil achievement weekly. Throughout the year pupils collect points (called penguins) for good work or excellent behaviour, which are added to their class charts and house total. Pupils collect these rewards and save them to exchange into Penguin Pounds which they can spend at Pablo's shop.



Every week we hold a 'Pupil of the Week' assembly and a child from every class is chosen to receive this award, which is celebrated by the whole school community. Parents are invited to this celebration and we also announce the weekly house points and winners of the class attendance award. We also celebrate 'Pupil of the Term' and 'Pupil of the Year'.

CORRIDOR CODE

At Penshurst, we have a set of rules called 'The Five Ss'. These are rules we follow when in community areas such as the corridor.



LUNCHES & PARENTPAY





Penshurst uses a system that enables pupils to pick their own meal for the day during registration time. This is a really interactive start to the day and takes account of the allergies that pupils may have, ensuring they cannot pick the wrong meal. If you feel your child may struggle or forget what they would like, please feel free to send in a note to the class teacher.

The menu is nutritionally balanced to ensure pupils have healthy options throughout the week. There is always a choice of a sandwich, jacket potato, vegetarian meal, or a hot dinner.

Pupils' meals are registered on the school online payment system, ParentPay, and can be paid for on the ParentPay website or in cash at a PayPoint location (usually newsagents or local shops). All children in Key Stage 1 are entitled to a free school meal, which they can choose from our menu.







COMMUNICATIONS

Effective communication between Penshurst Primary School and the parents/carers for our pupils is extremely important, with this in mind we have invested into an electronic communication system; SIMS Parent. SIMS Parent enables us to communicate more regularly with you regarding your child's achievements, attendance and academic progress. You are also able to check and update your contact details via the SIMS Parent App in a more convenient way than contacting the school.

EARLY YEARS FOUNDATION STAGE

At Penshurst Primary School, our Early Years Foundation Stage (EYFS) is where learning within The Hessle Academy begins. These early years in the Nursery and Reception classes form the foundations of your child's ongoing education and that is why we passionately believe in making a child's first years in school as stimulating, memorable and inspiring as possible.

We recognise that every child has their own personality and individual needs. We see it as our responsibility to provide them with a warm, safe, and nurturing environment in which to grow and thrive.

The children in the EYFS are taught through a play-based curriculum. Our teaching and learning is driven by the children's interests. We work closely with the children to understand what they enjoy, and we tailor our plans and environment to match this. The children have a large, well-equipped inside and outside area which they can access throughout the day.



TAPESTRY



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We ask that you read a story book with your child for ten minutes a day. We also use Tapestry to send home suggested activities e.g., sounds from phonics and mini projects.

YEAR 1-6 HOMEWORK

Homework is set through an online platform and includes reading, maths and challenges on a weekly basis. The work is set in each year group appropriately for age and stage. We also host the 'Penshurst Graduate Award' which allows pupils from Year 3-6 to study extra topics based on our thematic curriculum. They are tested on their knowledge and earn badges. Successful completion of 'PGA' tests are celebrated in reward assemblies
