For some of you that will be exciting and, for others, it may be an anxious time, so here at Hessle High School

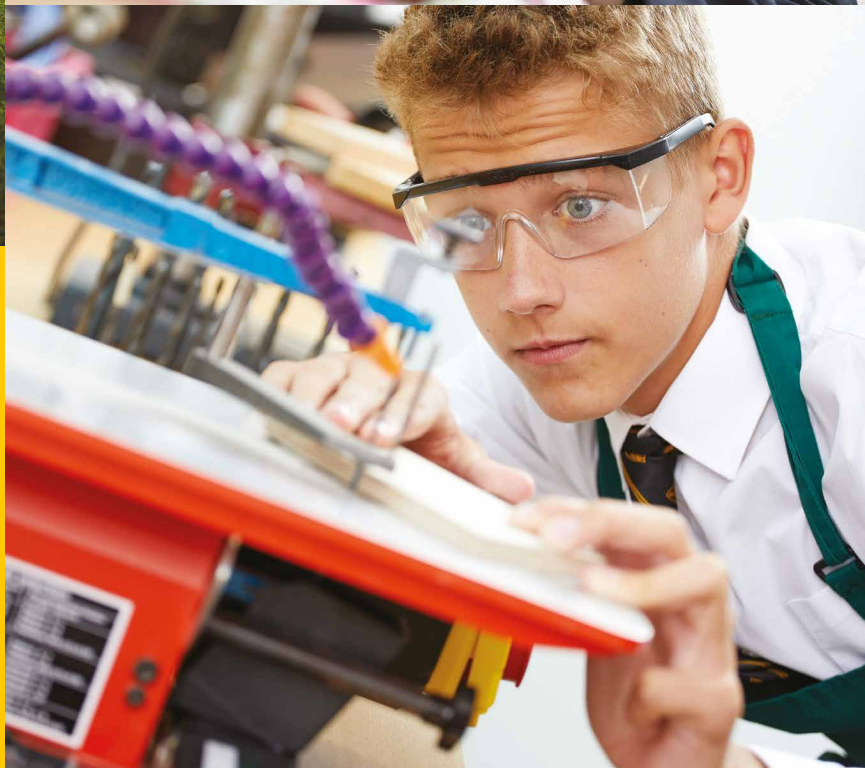
& Sixth Form College, we have prepared this 'Moving Up Guide' just for you and all the other students like you who are joining us in September.

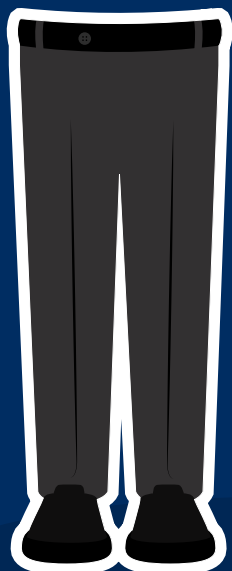

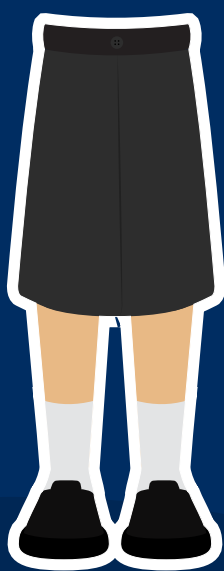
Our Uniform



All students from Years 7-11 are expected to wear the Hesse uniform.



- **Trousers:** plain black, full length, waist high, tailored



- **Skirt:** plain black knee length flared, pleated or A line

- **Shirt:** plain white, loose fitting
- **Blazer:** black with school logo



- **House tie:** must be worn with six visible stripes



- **Shoes:** plain black, leather or leather look, polishable

Jewellery and piercings

One small, metal stud may be worn in each ear. No other jewellery or studs in face or body should be worn.

Make-up

Must not be worn in school.

Hairstyles

Extremes of unnatural hair colour will not be accepted. Stripes/patterns, mohican or mohawk styles are not permitted.

Indoor PE Kit

House colour and royal blue panelled polo shirt with school logo. Royal blue shorts. White socks. No outdoor shoes to be worn for indoor activities.

What is Transition Week?



We believe that students benefit greatly by getting to know us prior to their official start in September.

Our induction process has been designed to ensure students adjust well into the school setting, encouraging them to begin secondary education with a positive attitude to learning.

Now that you are confirmed as a Hessle student, we will write to you and your parents regularly with information about your new school.

This builds up to the highlight of the induction process - Transition Week, which takes place between **Monday 11 and Wednesday 13 July 2022.**

Over those three days, you will attend Hessle High School & Sixth Form College, going to lessons, meeting your new tutor and finding your way around.

You will get to know lots of new people and find out just what it is like to be a student at your new school.

We are very excited about it – we hope you are too!

Attendance and Behaviour



Attendance

At Hesse, high attendance is a priority, and our target is for every student to achieve 96% or better attendance.

We will contact any parent/carer if a student's attendance falls below 96% (this equates to seven days of absence across the whole school year).

Evidence shows that students who have a high attendance record are more successful, not only in school, but in all areas of their life. Regular attendance at school is essential for students' academic achievements and progress. It also helps your social life as well as you maintain regular contact with your friends in school. The routine of daily attendance and punctual arrival is an excellent life skill for students to learn and prepare them for their future careers.

Behaviour

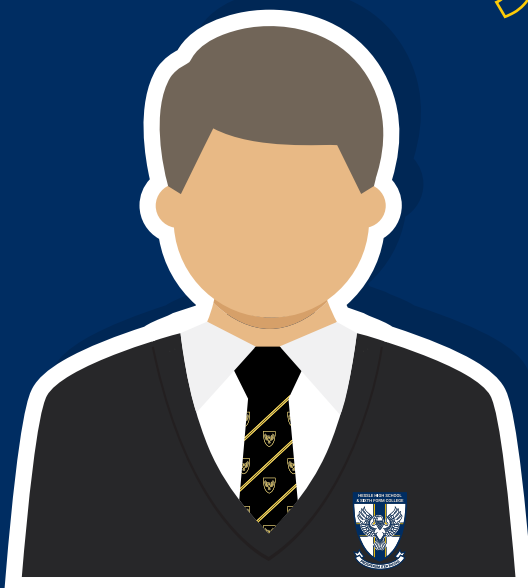
My son has had a great time during Transition Week. He says he is really looking forward to starting high school in September.

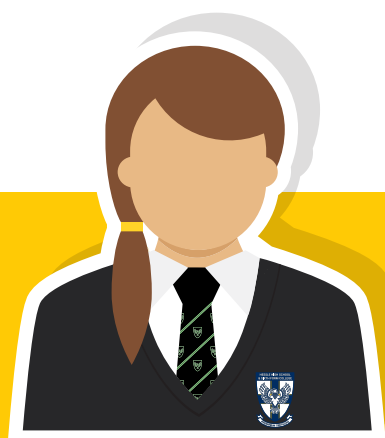

Healthy Lifestyles

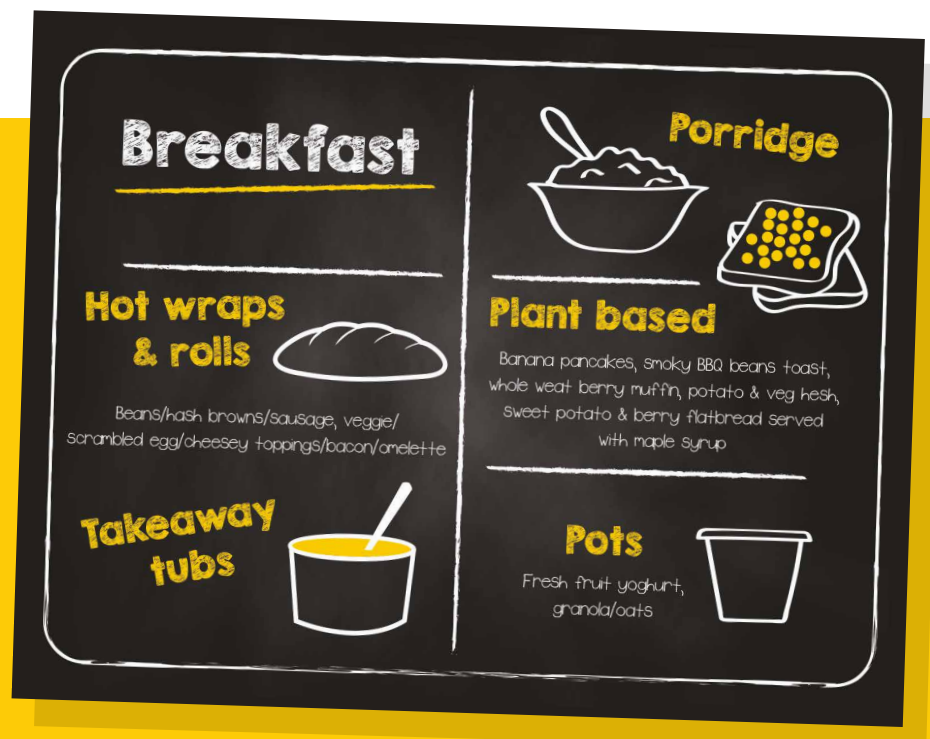
We encourage all of our students to engage in lifestyles that are healthy and respect the environment.

Hessle High School & Sixth Form College operates a cashless catering service using your biometric finger image to access.

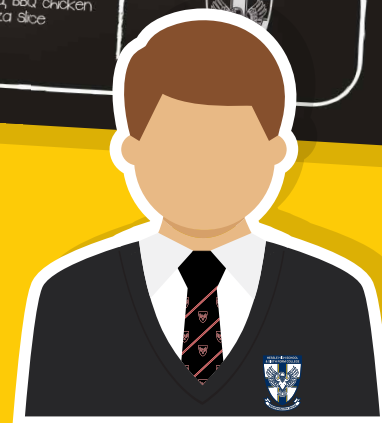

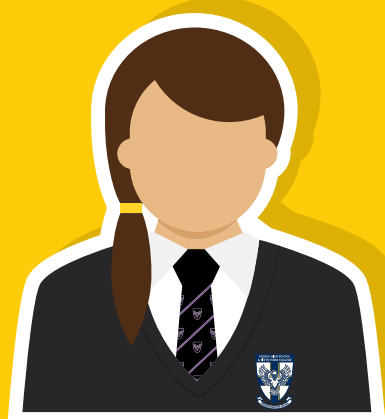

We are delighted that each year our Sixth Form appeals to significantly more than half of our Year 11 students.

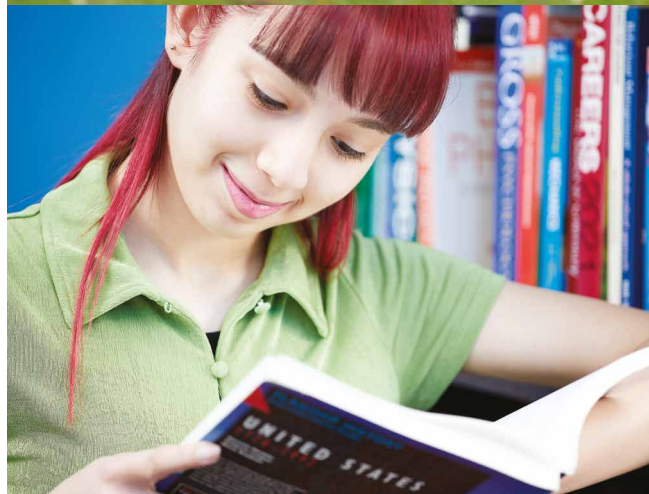
