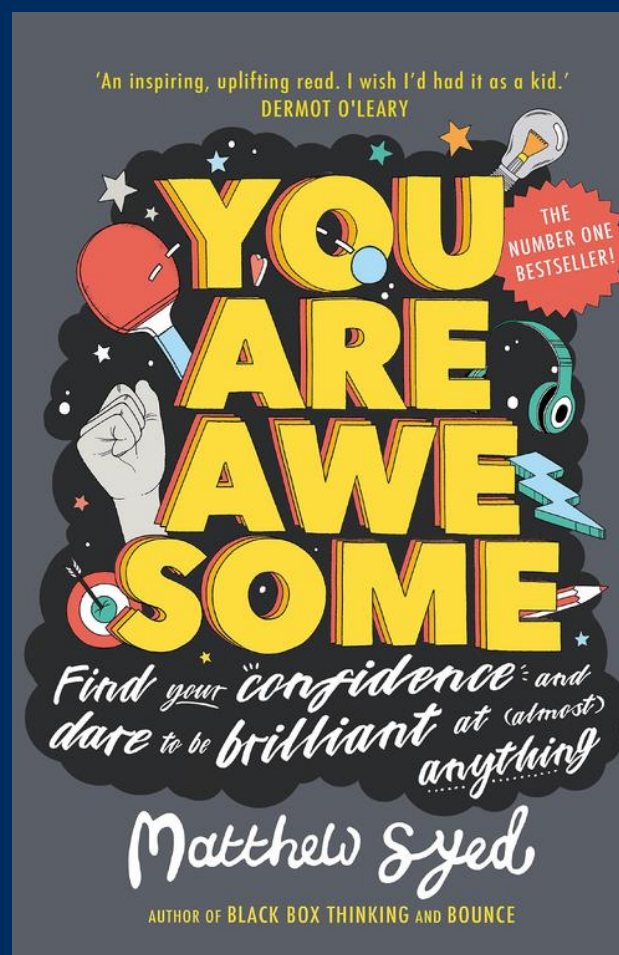

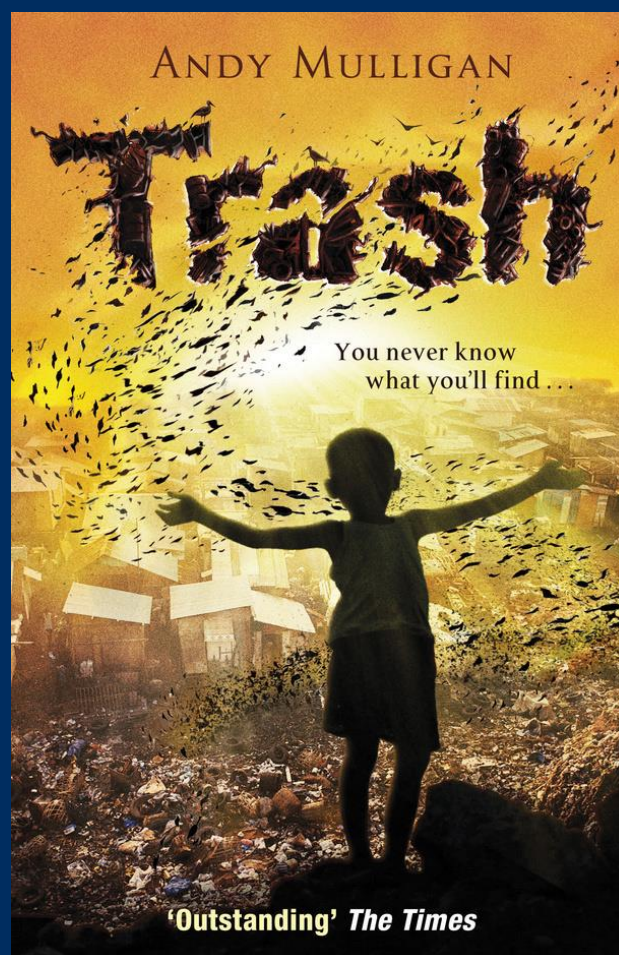

Trash

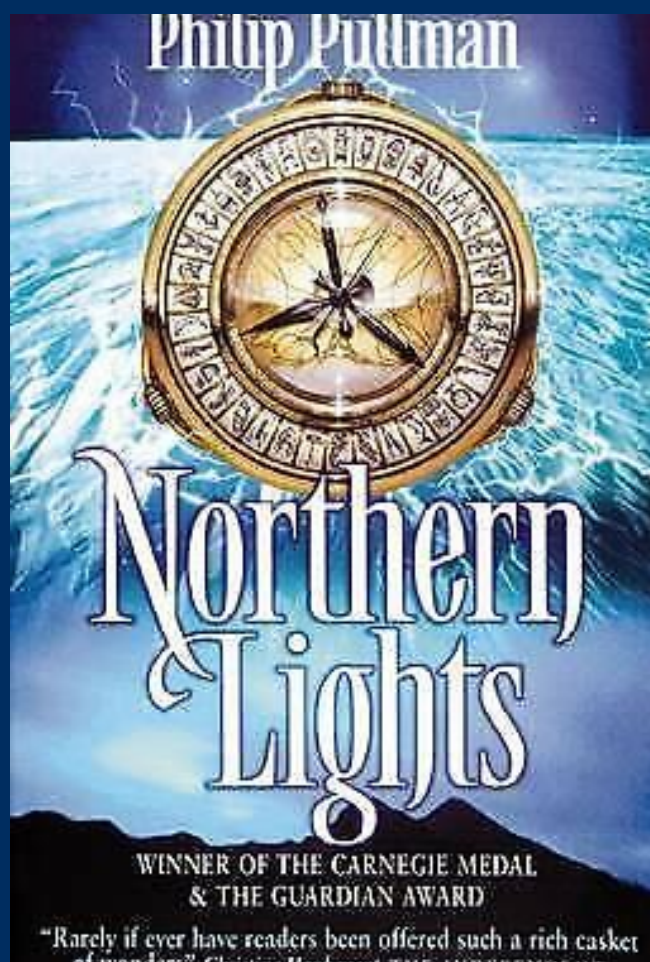

Northern Lights

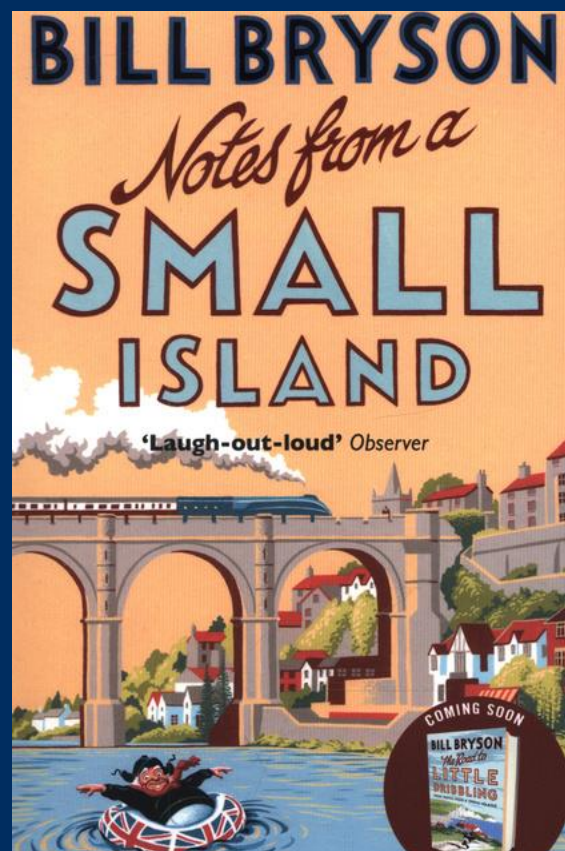

Notes from a Small Island

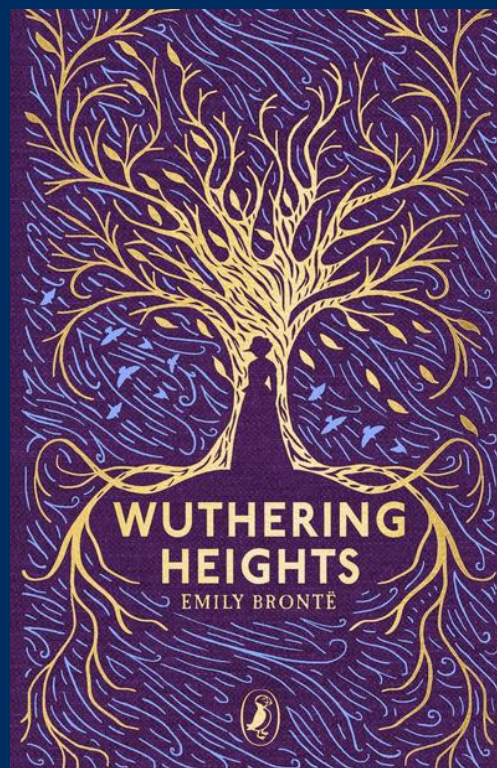
